Landscapes for Water Workshops

Visitors from the National Trust and Yorkshire Water came into school this week and delivered a workshop entitled: 'Landscapes for Water.' The focus was to raise our children's awareness of the importance of trees and how they can help in supporting their ambitious project.



This year, they are wanting to plant 300,000 trees in the local area, to improve our woodland areas and to minimise the risk of flooding in the future. It was wonderful to see our children fully engage with these workshops, and heartwarming, be inspired to help.

In the coming months, some of our children will be helping in planting some of these trees around Baitings Reservoir. I was then asked by some of our KS2 pupils about what else we can do. So, get your shovels ready, for soon I will be sharing an SOS to help plant some trees (105 to be precise) in our school grounds!

I am delighted to announce a partnership with Cherry Tree Adventures, which is based just off Allan Park in Sowerby Bridge. Starting in October, our Year 1 class will be visiting this Forest School throughout the year, with our Reception class starting after February half-term. Mrs Cameron and I, have met with Kit, who is a fully qualified Forest School Practitioner, and we came away enthused and excited about this amazing opportunity. Parents of children in Y1, you will shortly be receiving a letter with more information.

When I applied for the job as Headteacher, in my presentation, I spoke at length about my passion for the outdoors and my commitment to ensuring that here at Triangle, our children are given more opportunities to learn outside the classroom. I am therefore delighted that we have been able to arrange such a wonderful opportunity for some of our children. Ultimately, we are working towards developing a Forest School Program on site, for ALL our pupils to benefit from. Given the enormity of this project both in terms of work and funding required, this is likely to be a 3-5 year project.
