'Some of the artefacts were over 4500 years old. We even saw a real mummified body that had been brought to the museum by an archaeologist.'

'I really liked the afternoon when we got time to look around the museum - there was a T-Rex bone - it was massive! There was also lots of fossils of ancient creatures and statues of people from the past.'

'I also really liked the part of the museum that had living endangered animals in. I learned that these animals would be released into the wild once they are older. '
