# Holiday Club- Book your place

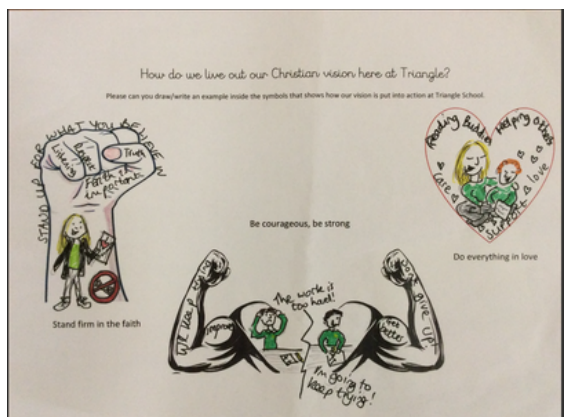
