The Valentine's Disco: A Night to Remember!





World Book Day - A look ahead



World Book Day is fast approaching, and the Literacy Leaders have been helping Mrs Barlow to plan what the children would like to do this year. The Literacy Leaders have suggested (optional) dress-up, either to come as a book character or to 'dress as word' - for example, wearing some bright clothing and coming as 'Florescent'. **The date Thursday 6th March**.

The children will be participating in some book and illustration themed activities on the day. Some of the activities will be led by Mr Roberts (a regular volunteer at Triangle) and Mr Burgoyne (Mrs B's husband) who have written and illustrated a lovely book, 'Luna has a Seaside Splash'.



Copies of their book are available for children to purchase on the day (and afterwards) with Mr Roberts available in the school reception area on World Book Day at the end of the school day. Books can be paid for in cash or by bank transfer at a discounted cost of £5.99. The book has a discussion guide, grammar and vocabulary prompts and lots of information in addition to the story, and is a fantastic book to be used both as a story to enjoy and to support children's education.

Teachers are dedicated to their pupils during the school day and I have actively advised them not to check Class Dojo during teaching hours or outside of their working day. This means that parents should not expect instant responses to messages. Teachers will reply as soon as they are able, but we must respect their time and the demands of their role.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding. By working together, we can continue to make Class Dojo an effective tool for supporting your child's learning experience. For urgent communication, please remember that the school office remains the most reliable and appropriate point of contact.
