School Development Plans

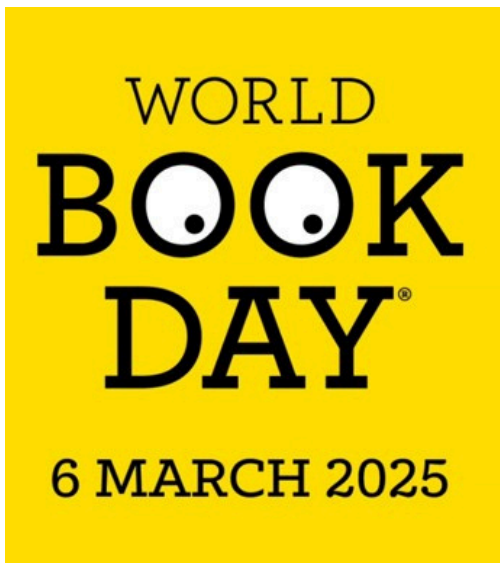
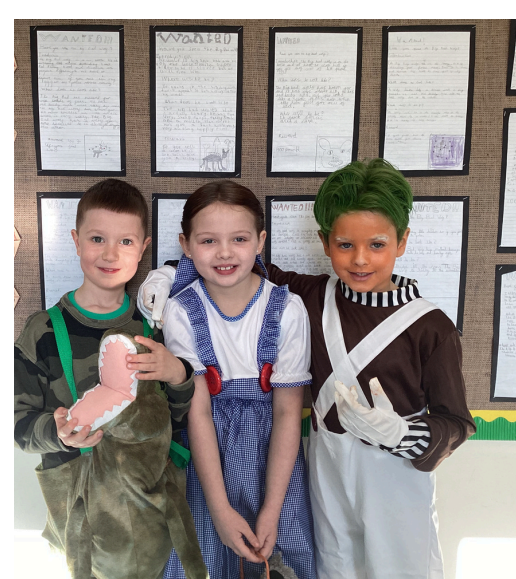
